To parents:

This page lets you know what your child learned today in Sunday School. Included are "Words to Remember" from the Bible, a suggested activity to reinforce the lesson, and a short prayer. Being involved and interacting with your child can be very rewarding for both of you.



What We Learned:

Rulers and leaders have a big job to do because many people depend on them. In Jesus' time, there were both good and bad leaders just like there are today. Today's lesson taught us about leaders who made bad decisions about Jesus and how we can learn to make good decisions. Some rulers make bad decisions, but we can do what is right. God will help us obey Him even when leaders don't do what is right.

Scriptures used: Mark 15:1-15

Words to Remember:

(Bible versions used are selected to help young children learn and understand the meaning of scripture.)



"Though rulers sit together and slander me, your servant will meditate on your decrees." Psalm 119:23 NIV

Write the verse on a piece of recycled cardboard with your child. Read the verse to him or her and explain that even when rulers or leaders make bad decisions we can still obey God and trust that He will help us. Then cut the cardboard into 4-6 unique puzzle pieces. Help your child put the puzzle together while asking him or her to point out any recognizable letters or words. After completing the puzzle, read the verse out loud again.



Suggested Parent/Child Activity:

Teach your child an activity, such as folding laundry, sweeping, or putting away groceries. As you work together, talk about how leaders should be kind, patient, understanding, sacrificial, and loving while displaying these qualities to your child. Once the activity is complete, ask your child how it felt to be lead in such a manner. Encourage him or her to lead other family members and friends in similar ways because it pleases God.

Thank You, God, for Jesus. Help us obey You even when leaders make bad decisions. And teach us to be helpers who show love and kindness. Amen.
